The Need for an Alternative Voice

The sinking of another boat off Indonesia last Wednesday with the associated loss of dozens of lives capped off a very bad week for our country. In the political sphere, the priorities and policies of our two major parties have frequently been described as a 'race to the bottom'. In the eyes of many, the so-called PNG solution saw our government finally win that race in a photo finish from their opposition.

Confirmation of this status has been available in the full page advertisements which have appeared in our state newspaper every day this week and

presumably in all newspapers across the nation. The colour picture of a decrepit fishing boat on the expansive ocean is accompanied by the text, "If you come here by boat without a visa, you won't be settled in Australia." The use of the personal pronoun "you" in this case led me to wonder how many asylum seeking refugees in Indonesia and other parts of Asia are regular readers of *The West Australian*. As I'm sure most people are aware, this advertisement is not intended to dissuade those who might take such a hazardous boat journey but rather to feed the xenophobic tendencies of that group in our society which is sadly becoming more influential.

At CBC Fremantle we talk frequently to our young men about the importance of not accepting populist thinking at face value. We seek to provide an alternative

voice to that found in our often selfish society and instead promote values which support family, commitment and concern for the other. On important social issues such as how we as a nation respond to the plight of others, it is critical that we present a clearly articulated position and do not allow the discussion to be hijacked by the vociferous.

For true freedom of thought it is imperative that moral decision-making is grounded in sound process. At the College we do this in many ways but one of the more prominent is through the S.T.O.P. method.

Search the facts – A critical component of good decision-making involves knowing what you are talking about. Knowledge of the facts is essential for distinguishing right from wrong.

Think – about alternatives and consequences. It is always important to remember that a good outcome can never justify an evil means.

Others – As Christian people we believe that we live for others. We must be unselfish in our behaviour and consider the effect of our actions from the perspective of the other.

Prayer – The example given to us in the life and teaching of Jesus will always provide a reliable moral compass.

I very much doubt that the recent decisions made by our country's leaders would have been the same had this process and a commitment to the common good been in place.

As a faith community and a member of the Edmund Rice Education family we are called to be inclusive, accepting and welcoming. The Charter for our schools requires us to stand in solidarity with those who are powerless and marginalised. This is a stance which we proudly take at the College and I thank those families who support our endeavours through their teachings at home.

Join in Perth's community running event of the year and show your true colours.

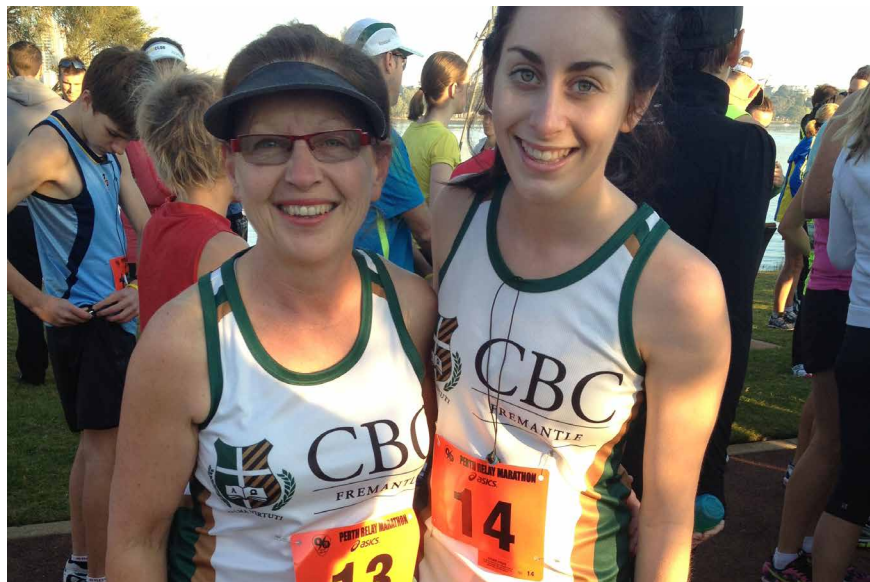

Mums Raising Teenage Boys

Monday 5 August, 6.30pm – 9.00pm

However well-prepared mothers are logically, the emotional response to having a boy is often still, "Wow! This is unknown territory." It is true that for many mothers, the idea of raising a son carries its own set of worries.

As the primary female role model in a boy's life, mothers play an important role in the development of their son's identity including their ability to be nurturing. This in turn affects how they relate to others, particularly to girls and women.

Mums Raising Boys in a Solo Parent or Fly In Fly Out Family

Tuesday 6 August, 6.00pm – 8.30pm.

When your partner is regularly away, or when you are a solo parent, different family life challenges can result. Often there are specific emotional and practical difficulties to manage such as feeling isolated or lonely, or not having a partner available to deal with discipline and other parenting issues. This seminar explores parenting teenage boys from a more 'solo' perspective and gives mums useful and supportive strategies to help them meet challenges more effectively.

Transperth Shutdown

Second shutdown from 31 July to 4 August

The second shutdown is needed so trains can switch between the Fremantle and Joondalup line tunnels, which will improve how the rail network operates. To carry out this work, Perth Underground will be closed from the afternoon of Wednesday 31 July to last service on Sunday 4 August.

The shutdown will impact the Joondalup, Mandurah and Fremantle lines. It is important to note that each affected line is impacted differently.

Fremantle Line: Last train to Fremantle departs Perth at 2.45pm.

Last train to Perth departs Fremantle at 3.24pm.

Joondalup Line: Last train to Clarkson departs Perth Underground at 2.25pm.

Last train to Perth Underground departs Clarkson at 1.45pm.

Mandurah Line: Last train to Mandurah departs Perth Underground at 2.10pm.

Last train to Perth Underground departs Mandurah at 1.28pm.
