his authenticity and ability to ‘connect’ with the congregation ensure that he is a special blessing to our school.



Lower School Examinations

Years 7 to 10 exams commence Monday 10 June and run for approximately a week and a half.

While examinations can be daunting, they present us all with an opportunity to show what we know and get feedback on what we need to know. Teachers want students to do well and we will provide extra support for students where we can.

Some things to remember:

- Know your examination timetable; place exam times on your Study Planner
- So that you can study prior to exams, homework often decreases. Plan how you will use this available time to study for all exams. Again, use your study planner.
- When studying, take notes, use a highlighter or Post-Its. Don't study on

your bed or in front of the television. In order to achieve your best, you need to study at your best.

- Have everything you need for an exam ready 24 hours in advance. This way you have an opportunity to get or purchase anything you may need.
- Know the exam rules – silence on entering the room, stationary in a clear container or plastic bag, use only a clear water bottle and no food.
- Once in the exam room, having followed directions, pick a desk where you will feel most comfortable.
- Use the reading time at the start of the exam properly. Read each question carefully and calmly. Plan how you may approach an essay. If you have choice, think of the positives and negatives in attempting each question.

- When working use all the available time. You should never stop looking for extra marks. Check your answers or add to some written sections. No-one should close their paper until the supervisor says the time has finished.
- Above all, be prepared. A well-prepared student soon calms down in an exam and performs well.

Campus Ministry

On Monday 10 June and Tuesday 11 June Mr David Kobler from Choicez Media will visit our College and run a series of seminars for students and parents.

On Monday he will conduct a reflection day for our Year 12 students. The aim of the day is to present a powerful process of change that gives each young man a compelling vision of what he can do, be and offer to the world.

He will explore some of the big issues including masculine identity and how we can help young men avoid proving their manhood in toxic ways, including sexual conquest, pornography, alcohol abuse and violence. Instead, a new vision of relationships built on an accurate understanding of masculine strength and the positive role it can play with

women, family members and the wider community is offered as an authentic pathway to happiness.

On Monday evening, David will present a talk to parents about the major challenges your child is facing as he goes through adolescence. Topics include:

- Media, marketing and advertising and its impact on your child.
- Alcohol and sexual decision-making.
- The rapid growth of pornography and how it is affecting young men.
- Rites of passage and your son's journey to manhood.
- How to parent your son through a sexually saturated society.

I strongly recommend that you make the time to come and hear the message that David has to offer. He is skilled in helping

parents come to a better understanding of how to help their sons navigate their journey to adulthood while being assailed by stealth advertising, a rampant consumer culture and unfiltered new technologies, which can expose our boys to explicit pornography and violent fantasy worlds packaged as entertainment. On Tuesday David will offer a series of shorter age-appropriate workshops to students in Years 9 to 11. These 90 minute sessions will deal with how to form positive relationships with girls and how to avoid diminishing their dignity by accessing pornography and engaging in the transmission of inappropriate content via their mobile phones (eg. "sexting").
